President's Message

It is December and it is time to have our annual Holiday Party. This year it is at Linda and Al's house in the beautiful Tucson foothills. As is our practice we will vote for the 2013 Executive

Board. As many of you already know, Diana Raymond has graciously accepted a nomination to be the 2013 President. Please join me in thanking her for stepping up and helping out.

As this is my last message to you, there are couple of issues I would like to cover. I personally believe that the Board and the committee chairs have a responsibility to put together events that attract the majority of its members. I have a concern regarding this as too many times this year we have sponsored events and only the same five or six cars participate. That clearly indicates to me that 90% of you are not interested in these events.

As a result I am making several recommendations to the 2013 Board. I am sharing two with you in this letter. The first of which has already been approved at our November meeting.

- **Establish a Social Committee:** The Board approved this at our November meeting. For 2013 Marianne Fortunato has graciously agreed to Chair this committee. Her charter is to provide you with one restaurant event (other than Ric's) per quarter. She was my first choice as her past record on organizing these type of events is stellar. However your participation will determine if this continues to be offered in 2014. Therefore if you like this type of event, please attend and help her make it a success.
- **Driving Events**: Many other Jaguar Clubs have stopped all driving events that require a deposit. They have determined that these events are not well attended enough to recover their costs. Given the lack of our

membership turnout for similar events, I too feel they are overly expensive. Therefore I strongly recommend this Board review any driving event that requires an upfront

deposit. If there has been little interest, then provide something else.

Get involved (yes I mean you): The JCSA is what you make it. Right now a small group of very dedicated members do 99% of the work to provide events for you. <u>They need your</u> help and participation. Your input is critical to

the success of this club so please get involved. Recently I have been accused of being strongly against JCSA providing free liquor at some of our events. This is absolutely correct. If there is a car accident and it is discovered the member or guest was at a Jaguar party with free liquor, the Board could be sued. Remember, Jaguar owners are considered to have very deep pockets and unlike some governing Boards or Corporations, our Board is not indemnified by JCNA's insurance. In addition homeowners or umbrella type insurance will not cover this type_of lawsuit. The personal liability to each board member is just too great. It has been an honor being your President for 2012. My participation in JCSA and JCNA will continue to be strong in 2013. I have asked to be the JCSA Membership Chairperson and Concours Vice Chair. I expect to be an active member of the Advisory Committee in which I will work closely with our new President. In addition I have been accepted on the new JCNA Membership Committee representing our SW Region.

Lastly, we have had several members suffer health setbacks this year. My best wishes for a full recovery to each one and please everyone take care this coming year.

Other Business

Offer from Cutting Edge Refinishing: Free hors d'oeuvres and drinks during a tour/promotion of their business. We will try to add as an event on our activity calendar. Proposed dates for up-coming event are: Sun. Jan 20th for Mystery Drive; Sun. Feb 17th for Wine Tour.

Concours Chairman: Searching for a new volunteer to fill this position; also need a new Chief Judge and Driving Chairman.

A proposal to establish a phone notification committee was put on hold.

Diana Raymond agreed to run for Club President.

Discussed ways we could support Royal Jaguar's sales and business. Discussed other future events, including a possible "F''-Type Introduction gathering.


