The 2015 Jaguar Heritage Challenge will be open to cars made by the Leaping Cat marque before 1966, including the C-Type, D-Type, E-Type and Mk I and MkII sedans. The series, which builds on the success of the previous Jaquar E-Type Challenge, will be administered by the Historic Sports Car Club (HSCC) based at Silverstone and will include four races in the UK and one in Europe, with the exact schedule still to be determined.










Minutes of Board Meeting - November 15, 2014

The meeting was called to order at 1pm followed by serving of pizzas.

- Concern was expressed for Cathy Anderson who is seriously ill in hospital. A get well card was circulated for signatures and given to Dan to give to Cathy from JCSA.
- The minutes of the last meeting were read and approved.
- ♦ The treasurers report was given by Dan Eklund.

The club President Fred Secker was approved as co-signee for the JCSA bank account.

A large overspend at the concours was a result of a costly venue for the cocktail party (due to non availability of the Windmill Inn) and the lack of sponsor to cover the catering at the cocktail party and at the registration desk. It was stated the 2015 concours should be as close to break-even as possible. It was decided that a portion of the income from the 2013 silent auction would go towards the cost of this year's concours and the remainder would be added to the income from this year's silent auction and the First Wednesday raffle to equally support 3 charities, Youth On Their Own, Northern Jaguar Project and Casa de los Ninos. A formal presentation of the checks to each charity will be made by the president when photos will be taken for future publicity. Donating to 3 charities will qualify the club for media coverage.

The First Wednesday raffle will be conducted by Chan Dayton for the first 4 months of 2013. Dan will contact members who signed up for discounted membership renewal. Discounted membership renewal will also be offered to members attending the Holiday Party.

Approval was given for Skip Bailey to be recompensed for cost of mailing club newsletters.

- ♦ The concours was discussed in detail and it was noted that there were considerable difficulties to overcome mainly due to construction work in the areas we traditionally use. Nevertheless the event was very successful due to the excellent work put by Dan Eklund, Chan Dayton and the rest of the team. The construction work will be complete before the 2015 concours so the plan will be to use St Philips Plaza and Homewood Suites next year. A concours committee will be formed and will meet in the new year to move ahead with the 2015 event.
- ♦ The Valley Verde overnight trip held on Nov 7 & 8 was discussed. The event was a great success and much appreciation was expressed to Carol, Cathy and Colleen for their enthusiastic organization. Next year's overnight event will be organized by Carol, Colleen, Cathy and Marianne.
- ♦ The upcoming Holiday Party was discussed. It was decided to keep the cost the same as last year at \$35. The club will supply water, sodas, beer and wine. AJs will do the catering. Cathy and Jack Clifford, our kind hosts, will liaise with AJs.
- The venue for our First Wednesday was discussed. It was decided to continue to meet at Firebirds until a positive proposal for a new venue is received. New venue must have good parking, have an early bird special, provide separate checks and must be able to seat us all together.
- The lack of a club secretary was bemoaned and Fred agreed to call prospective members.
- Fred was tasked with getting generic club business cards.


