f you missed the JCSA trip to Silver City, NM, or "Cats on the Trail of the Mountain Spirits", you missed what I view as one of the best trips sponsored by the club. It had something for everyone. There were lots of twists and turns that challenged our race car drivers and some more gentle turns as we returned to the Bear Mountain Lodge. The weather was sunny and warm for the second weekend in November. But best of all, the members who participated were so flexible and so much fun. They made the trip such a wonderful experience and I would travel with them anywhere!

When you have a chance to go, stay at the Bear Mountain Lodge. The setting is beautiful and the management is committed to making your stay the best it can be. Because we booked all of the rooms at the Lodge, we were able to gather each evening in the great room for a cocktail party and not worry about being too noisy. I had a chance to spend time getting to know several members I recognized only because they wore name-tags. Saturday evening we dined at the Lodge. The service was good and the meal was excellent. I can see why the Tucson Museum of Art and groups from Saddlebrook return each year. I can't wait to go back.

Friday's dinner was at Tre Rosat in Silver City. It was not my original choice because the dining room can be noisy but it turned out to be a fantastic selection. The restaurant was closed for the first 90 minutes of the evening to accommodate our group. My meal was delicious. I would recommend the restaurant to anyone going to Silver City.

The Gila Cliff Dwellings are worth the hike. Rita Garcia, the volunteer coordinator, told us a bit about what we were going to see as we finished the lunch prepared by Diane's Bakery. I think all of us enjoyed her comments about the tarantula's month of love and how to avoid getting bit by snakes. Molly, our guide, gave us a sense of what the people who built the cliff dwellings were like. She took us through the caves and shared her ideas of what might have been the purpose of each of the rooms. The Gila Cliff Dwellings is one of the few sites where you can actually go into the caves. Don't miss it.

I have yet to get to the small arts shopping area in town but, thanks to the club, I now own a beautiful piece of pottery that will be a reminder of a weekend of laughter, relaxation, and delight.

Kelly Christensen and Claire Hampton have already started working on drives for future months. 

ROUTINE BUSINESS

The meeting was called to order at 1pm followed by serving of pizzas.

The minutes of the last meeting were read by Carroll Lam and approved.

Secretary's report by Carroll Lam

- ◆ 501(c)7/State Corporation status restored
- Historical membership status presented; handout distributed
- Mailings to no-email members
- ♦ File system
- ♦ Membership flyers from JCNA
- ♦ Board Member (aka Officer's) handbook prepared

Treasurers report was given by Dan Eklund.

- ♦ Projected EOY balance nearly \$7500


