This month sees the beginning of a new series of articles entitled "My Hobby" just to show that there is indeed life outside the Jaguar firmament. Hobbies can generate huge enthusiasm so hopefully there will be a stream of articles vying with each other to be the next to be published. Meanwhile I will start the ball rolling with an account of my interest in the sport of Radio Controlled Model Sailboat Racing. Note carefully the word "Racing" because this is not pootling around with toy boats on the local duck pond. This is serious competitive stuff where rules are applied just the same as in full size sail boat racing.

The Club

When two or more hobbyists are gathered together then shall there be a club. And indeed it did come to pass that the PMYC was created. The Pima Micro Yacht Club has been in existence for two years and now boasts 24 members, not all of which are active sailors. We regularly get 6 or 7 boats racing each week and the rest of the members are constructing

boats or plucking up the courage to join the hurly burly on the water. When the club was formed it was decided that we should all build the same boat so that we could compete on a level playing field. The kit we chose is the Victoria, made by Thunder Tiger in Taiwan. Construction is very easy and costs less than \$200 for everything needed to get sailing. It is 30 inches long and 42 inches high and has two servo motors, one to control the sails

and one to control the rudder. Included in the price is the radio transmitter which is used to send signals to the servos to adjust the sails and steer the boat. We meet every Monday to race at one of three small lakes at Lakeside Park, Reid Park or Christopher Columbus Park.

The Racing

We set out a pattern of bouys to race around and then we are ready for an afternoon of intense concentration. The race course is normally triangular such that the boats have to be sailed up wind, down wind and every direction in between. To add to the challenge the wind direction is rarely steady and can vary greatly in strength. The skipper who is quickest to detect these changes will get the best results. The most important phase of the race is the start. A mechanical timer counts down from 2 minutes to zero and during this two minutes the skip-

pers control their boats to cross the start line as close to zero as possible being very careful not to start early because this incurs a stiff penalty. The next task is to sail upwind to the first bouy which is the most demanding phase of the race because obviously it is not possible to sail straight into the wind and therefore a series of zig zags must be skillfully executed. After rounding the upwind bouy life becomes

a little easier as we are no longer trying to sail into the wind and we can make a mad dash around the two remaining bouys and over the finish line.

The Post Mortem

There is always a lot to talk about after a hard days racing and what better place for a convivial discussion than a local watering hole such as McGraw's Cantina.

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
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
