The History of the Jaguar Club of Southern Arizona

The Jaguar Club of Southern Arizona is one of the oldest clubs in North America, originally founded by soldiers stationed at Ft Huachuca, Arizona who returned from Europe after World War II. The club at that time was called the "Classic Jaguar Club". They were bringing back Jaguar automobiles after their occupation duties in England.

On the 5th of August, 1972, twelve Jaguar enthusiast met at Ft Huachuca to discuss problems with their respective Jaguars. The assemblage decided to form a club with officers, assigned responsibilities, etc., with the intent and purpose of helping interest persons in acquiring, rebuilding, and showing off Jaguars. The group was not interested in racing, but more in the technical aspects of where to get parts and how to rebuild Jaguars. The name "Classic Jaguar Club of Arizona" was agreed upon. Officers were elected and committee assignments made.

As more members were from the Air Force stationed at Davis-Monthan Air Force Base in Tucson, the club was moved to Tucson and renamed the "Jaguar Club of Southern Arizona" to encompass members throughout the southern part of the state. The Club was legally incorporated under the laws of the State of Arizona on April 4th, 1976.

At that time, as the only Jaguar Club in Arizona, it had members from Yuma, Nogales, Phoenix area, and Lordsburg, New Mexico. In 1978 the club sponsored the formation of a club in Phoenix to include the Northern part of the state which was named the Jaguar Club of Central Arizona.

The club was frequented by members of the Hollywood set when they were in Tucson to film at Old Tucson. Two of the more notable attendees were Clark Gable with his white XK120 with its red wheels, and Stewart Granger with his XK 120.

The club started holding a Concours d'Elegance soon after its formal chartering and held its 45th consecutive Concours in November 2017.

With strong leadership through the years and the great sponsorship of Royal Jaguar in Tucson the club has continued to flourish.

JAG XJ WILL REMAIN TOP CAT EVEN AS MORE SUVS LOOM

The XJ sedan will stay as flagship as Jag leaves luxury SUVs to Land Rover Luxury SUVs are back with a force and we haven't even reached Peak SUV -- the BMW X7 and the Rolls Royce Cullinan have yet to hit the market. It's tough to be a luxury brand without a rolling living room wrapped in cross-stitched leather today, but it's still reassuring to hear that Jaguar plans to play it cool.

Autocar reports Jaguar plans to keep the XJ sedan, rather than a potential large SUV, as its flagship, citing comments by Jag design boss Ian Callum. But the brand is not ruling out a larger SUV -- it's easy enough with the Land Rover parts bin nearby -- but according to Callum there is a consensus within the company that such an SUV would not be positioned as the company's flagship offering. "An SUV was discussed, but it's not the mainstay of the brand,"

Callum told Autocar at the Frankfurt motor show earlier this year. "There's more sophistication for a flagship sedan than a flagship SUV," Callum added. "Only one brand can have an SUV as its flagship due to its origins, and that's Land Rover."

This is news, first and foremost, because the XJ itself has been far from the top seller for the brand for the past few years, battling much higher-volume models such as the BMW 7-Series, Audi A8 and Mercedes-Benz S Class.

This means that even though a "J-Pace" SUV positioned above the F-Pace is still expected, Jaguar won't seek to make it a competitor to the long-wheelbase Range Rover Autobiography, opting to stay closer to the character of the brand instead of reaching for low-hanging profit. A large SUV from Jag, according to Callum, will opt to offer a sporty experience rather than becoming a Jag version of the Range Rover.

As for the XJ itself, expect to see the next-gen flagship sedan in 2019, by which time the current model will have reached the ripe old age of 10. This means that we'll see it in near-production form this time next year, while the J-Pace will likely materialize in 2020 if given the green light.



2018 Jaguar Sportbrake

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
