fter the Jaguar F-Type Project Seven, Range Rover Sport SVR and the Continuation Lightweight E-Types the Jaguar Land Rover Special operations (SVO) division is plotting its next historic resurrection, and there's a chance it could be the Jaguar XKSS. but the word "could" must be emphasizied because the XKSS is one of about four finalists - a "major contender" - among a long list of 65 ideas for the Special Operations to devote itself to. SVO projects need to have some kind of story behind them, a qualification the XKSS doesn't lack. In the 1950s Jaguar raced the D-Type to three Le Mans wins among its list of victories, but retired as a factory team at the end of 1955. When Jaguar decided to turn 25 unused D-Type chassis' into road-going cars, the XKSS was created. The company built the 25, but a fire at the Browns Lane factory destroyed nine of them. It is those nine that will be in the continuation run, should the XKSS get the nod.

Jaguar has already sold the six E-Type Lightweight models, each one for more a million pounds (\$1.52M US). The XKSS could undoubtedly command even more, with its legendary roots; the 1956 model that Steve McQueen bought for \$5,000 (and Jay Leno recently drove is said to be worth 30 million). We have to think that even if the XKSS isn't chosen right now, it will certainly get the green light at some point.

Drive, Brunch and Visit

ere on our doorstep we have a world class facility that is regularly listed as one of the top ten zoological parks in the world because of its unique approach in interpreting the complete natural history of a single region, the Sonoran Desert.

The grounds comprise 21 acres with two miles of walking paths, 16 individual gardens, 1,200 native plant species and 56,000 individual plants. The animal collection currently includes 230 native mammals, reptiles, amphibians, insects, and birds including a multispecies hummingbird aviary. In January 2013 the Warden Aquarium was opened focusing on the region's rivers, native fish and conservation efforts and the salt-water gallery showcases tropical species from the Gulf of California.

Visitors can see two live animal shows: Live and (sort of) on the Loose, showcasing often-misunderstood venomous reptiles, and Raptor Free Flight, home to one of the most accessible avian demonstrations in the U.S. The demonstration flies only native species and showcases one of only two raptor species in the world that hunt as a family group, like wolves, Harris' Hawks.

On Sunday March 22nd you will have the opportunity to drive your Jaguar, have brunch at the Ocotillo Restaurant and visit the Sonoran Desert Museum all in one package.

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
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
