#### **CATS RETURN TO SILVER CITY**

We've planned a wonderful trip for club members to Silver City, New Mexico November  $14^{th} - 16^{th}$  of this year. It starts with what a former trip planner called the Dramamine Lite from Safford to the New Mexico border. We'll stop in Safford for lunch (on your own) and then pick up Highway 180 and head to Silver City. Once again, we will stay at the beautiful Bear Mountain Lodge.

www.bearmountainlodge.com. Our plans could stop there and the trip would be a success because life is wonderful at the Lodge. There are two handicap rooms on the main floor and ten other rooms in the lodge and nearby casitas. Each room has a private bath. Some have balconies and a few have Jacuzzi tubs. The setting is relaxing with paths to wander, vistas to enjoy, animals to delight in, and delicious cookies just for the taking. You will enjoy the beauty of the area, the accommodations, the hospitality generously offered, and the delicious food served at breakfast. The Lodge is just minutes from Historic Downtown Silver City. Once you are settled in, you have several options before dinner. My favorite is to rest, stretch my legs, and wait for cocktails and appetizers in the Lodge. For those of you with energy to spare, there is the nearby Western New Mexico University Museum that once again has the largest and most complete collection of Mimbres pottery and materials in existence. Another option is to wander the trails around the lodge or to hike the 3 mile Dragonfly Loop that takes visitors to some petroglyphs. In Silver City there are the Silver City Museum, the Youth Murals throughout town, and, of course, shopping. Can't forget shopping!!

Friday evening, we will enjoy appetizers and a liquid libation. Andy will once again bring a mini-bar but if you have a preference, please bring your own. We can supply our own liquor in the great room but not the dining room. Dinner will be at the Bear Mountain Lodge. If you have dined there before, you know how good the food is. If this is your first time, you are in for a treat. The menu Friday includes Chicken Gumbo (spicy), Poached Salmon with Basil Sauce, and Prime Rib. For dessert, you can select from Chocolate Raspberry Layer Cake and English Lemon Pudding with Berries (GF.)

After breakfast on Saturday morning, Andy and I will head out to the City of Rocks with those interested in that option. Drivers who wish to test their skills along twist and turns, can travel on the Trail of the Mountain Spirit ending at the Gila Cliff Dwellings. Shoppers can wander from shop to shop finding treasures for the holidays. A fourth option, if there is enough interest, is to join Linda, an owner of the Lodge, for a cooking demonstration/lesson. You can't go wrong no matter what your choice. Lunch will be a box lunch of flank steak or chicken in a salad or sandwich unless you opt to get something in town or you participate in the cooking event.

Those who choose to drive the Trail of the Mountain Spirits can eat their box lunch at a table near the ranger station and then head to the trail to the Gila Cliff Dwellings. If you haven't been and if you are able to manage the hike, you really must do this. It is the only place I have seen where you can actually go into the caves. The loop is about a mile. The first quarter is relatively level. Then you will want your knee braces, sturdy shoes, water, and walking sticks because the second quarter of a mile is comprised of a steep climb along a winding stairway. Once at the top, the sticks come in handy as you walk into the caves. A park ranger provides guided tours during the day with volunteers inside the caves to answer your questions. The descent is gradual.

Saturday evening we'll once again enjoy cocktails before dining at the Bear Mountain Lodge. Dinner selections this evening will include Duck Comfit, Argentine Beef (spicy), and Crab Cakes. For dessert, your choices are Bread Pudding with Caramel Sauce and Chocolate Expresso Mousse (gluten free.)

After breakfast Sunday, we will head home. Those who wish to take the more direct route will head out NM 90 to I-10. Brave souls who haven't had enough twists and turns can travel the Dramamine route of years past or head into the White Mountains.

At the moment, all of the rooms at the Bear Mountain Lodge are currently booked. However, we do have a waitlist which we were able to clear just recently so do contact me if you wish to join us. ### **JAGUAR'S SALOON CHALLENGE**

Jaguar needs saloons. They've been a backbone since the heyday of company founder Lyons but not enough people are buying them now. Last year, the compact XE, launched in 2015 to fight the BMW 3 Series and Audi A4, made barely 19,000 sales in Europe (around 25,000 in the previous year) against 170,000 for the leading Mercedes C-Class. The mid-sized XF, recently refreshed and with the Sportbrake (estate) to help, does little better.

Replacements are nonetheless planned for both cars in the early 2020s, mostly because special long-wheelbase versions of both have recently gone on sale in China and Jaguar is prepared to bet the resultant volume will make them viable.



Big Jaguar saloon news is an **electric XJ**, due to be shown this year and on sale in 2019. The car is believed to be a second application for the twin-electric-motor architecture introduced with the I-Pace, with all the benefits in smoothness and cabin space we've already seen. Jaguar wants the new XJ to be seen as revolutionary – as several of its predecessors were in their time – in a category diminished by the rising success of luxurious SUVs.

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
