Engine Fail Safe Warnings

We are new members and I am not a mechanic; however, at this year's Concours d'Elegance, we entered our 2001 XK8 Convertible in the Display Only class and a discussion ensued among other XK8 owners about a common problem of Engine Fail Safe Mode. Having personally wrestled with this issue for the past three years, I would like to share what I have learned in the process.

Jaguar made the XK8 from 1997 to 2006 with a first ever 4L V8, that included a Failsafe System to govern most functions coming from various sensors within the vehicle to send data to the Engine Control Module (ECU) to be interpreted and perform diagnostic assessments to check if the vehicle is running properly. This includes data from the fuel system, ignition, emissions, transmission, and engine. This means if something goes wrong, it will activate the failsafe system to keep the car from being driven any further to avoid more damage.

In our case, we had a recurring Engine Fail Safe Mode warning that would completely shut down the accelerator system and issue an On Board Diagnostic (OBD) code P1229, which is a Throttle Motor Circuit Malfunction, meaning this involves everything relative to the Throttle Body. I had many mechanics involved in tracking down the culprit. Each time they did something, it seemed to work for four or five hundred miles. You may have tried some of these things yourself, so I wanted to list them.

- 1. Replace the engine management system relay
- 2. Replace the throttle motor power relay
- 3. Replace the throttle motor position sensor
- 4. Had the throttle body rebuilt

Frustrated but determined, I did as much research as I could and found an old Service Bulletin issued in 2000 saying the material used in the throttle motor harness connectors is susceptible to Metallurgical Deterioration. I also found an article entitled How to Fix Code P1229, which said, "Visually inspect the related wiring harness and connectors. Check for damaged components and look for broken, bent, pushed out, or corroded connector pins." I took this information to Eric at Tucson Foreign Car Specialists, who had experience with this issue and agreed with my assessment that it was a connector problem.

However, since there are no individual connectors or a throttle body harness replacement available, Eric's simple solution was to slightly twist the flat connector pins to make a better electrical connection. It worked for me and I am hopeful it will also work for you. Cheers!

The Jaguar Mark 2 Was, Is a Revelation

It is easy to see why the Jaguar Mark 2 became so beloved, regularly filling vintage racing grids, auction house lots, car show lawns, and top-10 lists of the greatest sports sedans of all time. This is the original, after all: a four-door with the power and poise to keep up with sports cars, plus luxury in abundance. In post-War Britain it was a revelation. It still is today.



Like many automakers in the Thirties and Forties, Jaguar was conscripted into supporting the War effort, but founder Sir William Lyons always had an eye on the future. The story goes that he and his engineers worked on a new straight-six during nighttime fire watches. This engine, the XK, debuted in 3.4-liter form with the XK120 sports car in 1948 and went on to power almost everything Jaguar made for the next three decades, including the Le Mans-winning C- and D-Types.



In the Fifties, riding high on its Le Mans victories, Jaguar wanted a new, entry-level sedan to complement its sports cars and its rather large Mk VII. The car would be of unibody construction, and while Jaguar considered making a four-cylinder adaptation of the XK engine, it wasn't refined enough. Instead, Jaguar made a 2.4-liter version of its 'six, and put it in a sedan creatively called the 2.4 Litre.

All the ingredients were finally in place with the Mark 2 3.8, and they were executed to perfection. Jaguar's slogan was "Grace, Space, Pace." Few cars so successfully live up to their taglines. Everything about the car is elegant, from the way it looks, to the way it drives.



The Mark 2 remains relevant to this day because the recipe hasn't really changed. Only the execution. Big powerful engine in the front, comfy interior, excellent rear-drive chassis. BMW got credit for inventing the super sedan with the original M5 of 1984, but how was it not just following the basic template Jaguar set?


