2023 International Jaguar Festival Moved to Columbia, South Carolina

It was recently announced that the International Jaguar Festival (IJF) to be held in Santa Barbara in October of this year was cancelled due to rising costs. To the rescue came the Jaguar Society of South Carolina with the Coventry Foundation. The IJF has been rescheduled for September 28 – October 1, 2023, at Saluda Shoals in Columbia, South Carolina. Registration information will be forwarded when it is received.

Jaguar Recalls all I-Pace EVs over Battery Fire Risk

Automaker Jaguar has announced a comprehensive recall of all its I-Pace electric vehicles in the United States, citing a potential risk of battery fires. The company is also advising customers to park outside until repairs are made and charge their vehicles outdoors so they don't burn their houses down.

Given the relatively low volume of I-Pace cars, the four fires are statistically significant, even more so than the dozens of Bolt EV fires. Despite the initial worries, it took the automaker a year to start the recall. Jaguar is now recalling all "2019-2024MY Jaguar I-PACE vehicles built at the Graz Vehicle Assembly Plant from June 5, 2018."

According to Jaguar's recall notice, the problem is a thermal overload that could cause the high voltage traction battery to burn or emit smoke. "Vehicles have experienced thermal overload which may show as smoke or fire, that may occur underneath the vehicle where the high voltage traction battery is located," the notice read.

Jaguar Classic Will Sell New E-Type ZP Collection Restomods as Pairs

Jaguar is paying homage to the first E-Types to win competition races, with a pair of special new-old classics. Sold as a pair, just 14 of the classic cars will be sold to seven buyers to celebrate the special history of what is perhaps the brand's most famous car. Lightly modified for modern usability, the cars are inspired by the two E-Types that were driven to victory by Graham Hill and Roy Salvadori in 1961. Sent into competition almost as soon as the car was revealed, the first car was driven to victory by Hill at Oulton Park.

JCSA Executive Board Meeting Notes July 1, 2023

The Concours will take place on November 11, 2023, at La Encantada. Judges training will be held sometime in October, date to be determined. The awards dinner will be held at Sullivan's. Commemorative logo shirts for the JCSA 50th Concours will be designed and order forms will be available in a few months.

Activities will resume in the fall, with San Diego and Tubac as possible destinations. The Holiday Dinner is scheduled for December 1 at Café a La C'Art, adjacent to the Tucson Museum of Art.

Membership is currently at 69, with 11 new members joining so far this year. The JCSA website has been revised to include a section on membership benefits and a description of club activities with photos.

Although the club is solvent, the Board discussed opportunities to increase revenue based on a decline in advertising and other sources of support. Part of the discussion was how to reduce costs, including offering an additional online payment option for membership and Concours registration. This topic will be continued at the October 4 Board meeting.
