JCSA EXECUTIVE BOARD MEETING

The Executive Board met on October 7, 2023. Two Board members will not continue next year and a solicitation for candidates for all positions will be issued; candidates will be announced in November. In addition to election of officers at the Dec. 1 holiday party, a vote will be taken on proposed amendments to the JCSA By-Laws clarifying the election process and review of dues. An update on the Concours was given by Chris Brewer. Royal has paid the club for sponsorship and merchandise; this may be the last year for Royal support of the Concours. Karen Bell said that 26 special edition Concours shirts were ordered by members. Bob Bell reported the club currently has 66 regular and 7 associate members. Of all the JCNA clubs for the last year, JCSA tied for 2nd for new members with an increase of 119%. Activities being considered in 2024 are a non-sanctioned rally with Clarke Harvey taking the lead to organize with others and a trip to Santa Fe, NM, May 2, being organized by Abbe Meyer.

ALL THINGS JAGUAR

F-TYPE ZP EDITION

Jaguar is attempting to reinvent itself as an all-electric brand and, as a result, its gas-powered cars will soon disappear. The first will be the F-Type sports car, which bows out with this new, limited-edition model, the ZP Edition. Jaguar will build 150 examples, and after that point, the internal-combustion Jaguar sports car will be no more. The odd moniker references early E-Type race cars, created under the project name "ZP." Mechanically, the F-Type ZP Edition is no different than the current R75 model, featuring a 5.0-liter, 575-hp supercharged V-8, all-wheel drive, and an eight-speed automatic transmission.

JAGUAR TO STRIKE TESLA SUPERCHARGER DEAL IN THE U.S.

The British car company has signed an agreement that will make its upcoming EVs compatible with the 12,000+ Tesla chargers that use the North American Charging Standard (NACS) connector. Jaguar's only electric car currently on sale, the I-Pace, does not use the NACS connector, but Jaguar says it will source and supply adapters from Tesla for I-Pace customers, once they are available. Going forward, Jaguar says its future electric cars, which are due to launch from 2025, will incorporate the NACS connector, making them compatible with the Tesla Supercharger network without an adapter. The latest, fourth-generation Supercharger can deliver power at a rate of up to 350 kW, matching that of other rapid chargers from networks like Electrify America and Ionity. Today's electric cars generally recharge at a rate of around 150 kW to 250 kW. The third-generation Supercharge tops out at 250kW, which is still plenty for most EVs on the road today.

CAR PARTS SHORTAGE

Up to 10,000 Jaguar and Land Rovers are currently undriveable and off the road as the firm struggles with a part supply shortage that is leaving owners stranded without their vehicles. The British firm, now known as JLR, has run out of courtesy cars to put customers into, with some left without vehicles for months. JLR recently held an event with its dealers that looked to address the problem. Details of this have now been leaked to Car Dealer, which says that 5,000 cars in the UK are waiting on parts, while another 5,000 [in other countries] are waiting on parts. In the presentation, Andrew Woolliscroft, JLR's client care director, admitted that the situation was a mess and unacceptable. JLR puts the problem down to it building a new global parts logistics centre, named Mercia, which looks to condense 18 warehouses into one one-million-square-foot site. It is also changing parts supplier.

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
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
