Our car is a 1954 XK120 SE, which we bought in 1986 in Clearwater, Florida. We had just moved from New York to Sarasota, Florida, and found it too hot to drive our 66 E-type coupe in the daytime. Mary found the advert in the local CarTrader. Mary was familiar with 120s as she was brought home from the hospital after birth in a brand new one her father had just bought in June, 1954. Our car is both a daily driver and a long distance adventure driver. We also have the E-type since 1985, still in regular use, alternating with the 120.


