2027 Jaguar I-Type Is an Electric British Behemoth Worth Waiting For

The I-Type represents a fresh start for Jaguar, which is discontinuing its entire lineup and replacing it with an arsenal of high-end luxury EVs. Stylistically, the I-type will draw upon the brutalist Type 00 concept but will apply the imposing looks to a four-door grand tourer body.

All future Jaguars will utilize electric powertrains, and the I-type will be the first vehicle built on the brand's new electric underpinnings. The Jaguar's electric powertrain should pack at least two motors, making the I-type all-wheel drive and appropriately potent, likely peaking at around 600 horsepower. The Jaguar I-type will enter production by the end of 2026 and should cost close to \$200,000.

In Defense of Jaguar's Radical Rebranding

Jaguar, the century-old company best known for some of the most beautiful cars in history, shocked the automotive world last summer by announcing it was ceasing production of its entire range of petrol-fueled vehicles, with plans to return as an EV-only manufacturer in 2026. In November, Jaguar created more shock waves by releasing a rebranding teaser ad featuring androgynous models in vibrant outfits and provocative poses in a video notable for its lack of any reference to cars. By and large, marketing and brand strategy gurus were gobsmacked and outraged, widely captured in media reports.

The harshly negative reactions were perhaps best explained by Roger Martin, ex-Dean of the University of Toronto's Rotman School of Management, and a frequent advisor to blue-chip companies on brand strategy issues. In a recent article Martin took exception to Jaguar's rebranding campaign, characterizing it as "marketing malpractice" and an "abomination" for three reasons:

- 1. Jaguar's teaser ad trashed all traces of Jaguar's legendary (if now enfeebled) brand with jarringly confusing imagery.
- 2. Even if the teaser succeeded in intriguing a new target audience, the visual cues were unnecessarily repugnant to consumers with fond memories of Jaguar's storied past.

3. The teaser ad made no meaningful promise to customers about the appeal of the "new Jaguar."

I couldn't disagree more. I'm not defending Jaguar's teaser ad per se, but rather suggesting that there are five reasons to give the company's controversial rebranding campaign the benefit of the doubt.

- 1. While Jaguar's sales have been trending down for years, most car companies would damn near kill to have Jaguar's unaided brand awareness and halo image for distinctively beautiful cars.
- 2. The marketing best practices that many pundits applied to critique this controversial rebranding effort are not contextually relevant to Jaguar's situation.
- 3. Jaguar's ad has already succeeded in two important respects: reinforcing the company's commitment to iconic style and fashion and stimulating a lot of conversation despite the brand's fading glory.
- 4. A similar relaunch ad Apple ran decades ago, which laid the groundwork for spectacular success, would also have generated the same harsh negative reviews by the same criteria many applied to Jaguar.
- 5. Nonetheless, Jaguar has set and will have to meet high standards of reimagined excellence in design, performance, and luxury, worthy of the company's storied past if its relaunch is to succeed.


