Kitt Peak National Observatory Drive

Drive to Kitt Peak with Telescope Tour and Picnic at the Observatory

Saturday, 20 September 2014

Rendezvous at the Arco Station, NW Corner of Speedway and I10 at 9 am.
Depart no later than 9.30 am.

Join us in a lovely drive through the desert on State Route 86, concluding in a beautiful drive up the mountain to Kitt Peak National Observatory. A large portion of the drive and the observatory are within the Tohono O'odham Indian Reservation. **Royal Jaguar has graciously agreed to co-sponsor this excursion and will cover the cost of the telescope tour and will provide a gourmet sandwich picnic lunch for us!**

We'll stop at the visitor's center when we get there to see what they have to offer and do a photo op in the parking lot. For those that expressed an interest, we'll depart for a one-hour walking tour of one of the telescopes at 10:30 PM from the visitor's center. The tour lasts a little more than an hour and is an easy round-trip distance of less than one mile with some easy slopes.

After the tour, we will then travel a short distance in our cars to the picnic area on the grounds of the observatory. Our picnic lunch will be supplied by Royal so don't plan on any cooking within the picnic area – it's not allowed.

Kitt Peak is at an elevation of 7,000 feet so it could be as much as 20 degrees or so cooler than Tucson.

Public Facilities: No food or gas facilities are available at Kitt Peak. Public restrooms are located adjacent to the visitor parking lot. A handicap-accessible restroom is located in the Visitor Center. There are also restroom facilities at the picnic area.

NB: There is a Border Patrol checkpoint on Highway 86 coming back from the observatory so if you're not a US citizen you should bring your passport.







Cat Tracks in Cottonwood

The Jaguar Club of Southern Arizona offers you an once-in-a-lifetime opportunity to participate in a weekend road trip in early November to Arizona's historic Verde Valley. The cost to participate is modest and includes nearly everything except alcoholic beverages and a very special dinner on Saturday evening.

Day 1 Friday, November 7

Drivers, start your engines. We will leave Tucson at 9am sharp (location is TBD) and will caravan North through some of Arizona's most beautiful scenery, featuring fun and exciting challenges for even the best Jaguar drivers.

Lunch break. We'll meet for lunch at the Lakeshore Restaurant at Saguaro Lake (480-984-5311) a bit north of Mesa. We'll choose from a special menu of sandwiches, salads, and burgers. Both lunch and beverage are included in the cost of the trip, but if you'd like beer, wine, or something more bracing, you're on your own nickel.

Hotel check-in. We'll be staying at the Best Western Cottonwood (928-634-5575). The Inn's standard rooms come with two queen beds, plus the usual amenities. Upgrades, handicap-accessible rooms, or casitas are also available, as is dedicated parking for our Jags. With luck, there will be time for naps and/or socializing before it's time to dust off your spurs and head out for the evening.

Dinner and western show. We are booked into the Blazin' M Ranch (928-634-0334) for a chicken and rib dinner with traditional accompaniments plus dessert. A vegetarian option is available, so let us know early if that's your choice. Also, if you'd like to belly up to the bar with anything stronger than sarsaparilla, you're on your own. This is a fun place, so get there early to experience their unique gift shop, photo gallery, steer-roping lessons, and photo-worthy women's restrooms -- and then check out your skills with a real Colt 45 (sorry -- wax bullets). Plan to stay late for their patented stage show featuring the award-winning Blazin' M Cowboys -- they claim their musical abilities will blow your spurs off.

Day 2, Saturday, November 8

Breakfast at the hotel. This comes with the territory. Mosey on down to the hotel buffet and help yourself.

Morning activities. Choice of a Jaguar Club visit to Tuzigoot National Park (928-634-5564 and be sure to bring your senior park pass if you have one). If you'd like to strike out on your own, you might shop in town or sleep late.

Lunch break. We'll all meet at the train station for a casual lunch of sandwiches, burgers, or dogs before boarding the train.

Afternoon train trip. The highlight of the weekend, the Verde Valley Railroad trip (928-639-0010), will take us on a four-hour journey through some of Arizona's most gorgeous and inaccessible-by-road scenery. Our route follows the Verde River, a lush riparian habitat of astonishing beauty. Narrators and cabin attendants will discuss the history, archaeology, geology, wildlife, and Native American lore of the Verde River Canyon. Our first-class accommodations include a glass of champagne with appetizers and, of course, a no-host bar will be available. Before or after the trip, you might make time to check out the gift shop at the train station. The shop is both unique and high-quality -- and the holidays are coming up.

A dinner to remember. We'll have dinner at The Schoolhouse (928-634-0700), a relatively new addition to Cottonwood's booming food dining scene. It's a new-American style restaurant offering an innovative menu and some of the Southwest's best local produce, meats, beers, and wines. The chef often amends the menu to include ingredients grown locally (perhaps in the restaurant's own garden) for the freshest tastes possible. In addition to local items, your dinner menu may include entrée choices such as pan-seared scallops, a vegan Thai salad, pork osso bucco, buttermilk fried chicken, or prime flat iron steak, plus appetizers and desserts. **Please note:** To accommodate all tastes and appetites, this very special evening is not included in the price of the trip. We estimate about \$100 for two cocktails, dinners, and desserts, but if you'd like more information, their menu is online at <http://www.vvschoolhouse.com/menu/>

Day 3, Sunday, November 9

Breakfast at the hotel. Again, this is on the house. Just help yourself and enjoy.

On your own. Sunday you can decide whether you want to stay another day or two, explore the local entertainment options, wander through the back roads, or head straight home to Tucson.

For another day or two. The Horn is a wonderful restaurant in Camp Verde: It is family-owned and well worth the stop if you are in the area. Other on-your-own options include wine tasting at local wineries, a tour of Montezuma's historic castle, balloon rides, cruises on Saguaro Lake, shopping, or a visit to Old Town Cottonwood's charming art galleries and museums. If you'd like to wander slightly afield, consider a stop at nearby Sedona or Jerome, or perhaps a treasure hunt in the legendary Superstition Mountains with a stop at the Lost Dutchman Museum.

We hope you can join us.

To be included, signup is a two-step procedure

This is non-refundable and includes your day 1 lunch for two people, plus taxes, tips, and miscellaneous costs incurred during the weekend. We need your check by September 15 at the latest, so we know whether we have the required 10 couples needed to make this trip possible.

(2) Call the Best Western Cottonwood Inn (928-634-5575) to reserve your room and entertainment package (have your credit card handy). To receive our special discounted price, tell the desk clerk you are with the Jaguar Club of Southern Arizona, group reservation number 1675, for Friday November 7 and Saturday, November 8. The discounted price is good through October 7. Reservations made after that date will be at full price and are subject to availability.

Price per couple

Standard room. A regular room for two people with two queen beds for two nights, including two breakfasts, two dinners and two stage show admissions to the Blazin'M, two first class train trip tickets plus two champagnes, two appetizers, and two lunches will run you \$418.

Casita. An upgrade to a casita for two people with the same meal and entertainment package brings the price to \$490.

Triple room. A standard room for three people with two queen beds for two nights, including three breakfasts, three dinners and three show admissions to the Blazin'M, three first class train trip tickets plus three champagnes, three appetizers, and three lunches is priced at \$556.


